Earliest Swift Memory – What's Yours?

My earliest Swift Memory dates back to about 1974; my father would typically spend Saturday and/or Sunday afternoon at the airport washing or tinkering on his 1961 P-35 Bonanza (N1560Z) followed by a quick flight around the patch with my often requested "Carrier Landing". As an inquiring minded 4 year old boy not easily amused with assisting my father in his hangar duty efforts, I would find myself exploring the surrounding hangars with great interest. The furthest set of T-Hangars from the entrance to the airport offered some of the greatest treasures; the structure was of aged creosote poles, rusty corrugated tin roofing and siding. With all my might, I would pry the sliding door open and gaze into the dark and gloomy hangar only to see what will forever be, "The Little Red Sport Plane".

I would ask my father about "The Little Red Sport Plane" and he would tell me about the two brothers who owned the airplane, The Miller Twins, Ed and Fred Miller; both served their country for 4 years to the day in the United States Army followed by obtaining their Electrical Engineering Degree, never having married or lived separately; both worked for Boeing, Vought and LTV. The Miller Twins bought their Swift in the early 60's, trading their Taylorcraft BC-12D for something that would better serve their commute from Grand Prairie, TX to Brookhaven, MS to visit their parents. In Grand Prairie, The Miller Twins worked for Vought Corporation which later became Ling-Temco-Vought (LTV).

By the mid-70's, The Miller Twins would commute from Grand Prairie, TX to Brookhaven, MS in their 1959 Cessna 182-B; during their frequent visits to Brookhaven, there would be an old car or truck parked in front of the hangar with the two elderly bald headed men (of which I have not a problem with elderly or balding) going to and from the vehicle with tools, cleaning materials and other various items as they tended to the needs of the inactive Little Red Sport Plane. The annual inspection would be performed by local mechanic, Bob Deaton and flown around the patch, Fred in the left seat and Ed in the right seat with the gear always down, then tucked back into the hangar.

Ed and Fred's adventures were thrilling and exciting, there is no doubt to anyone who knew of the Miller Twins, a single cell was split....they dressed alike, spoke alike and even placed their pens in the shirt pocket with the same order. I have the privilege of being the caretaker of their beloved 1946 Globe Swift – N78251....to this day; the leather wrapped headsets still hang inside the cockpit....Not To Be Forgotten!!
